"That for the purposes interstate within the District of Columbia or the territories of the United States, the term 'closed package for apples basket in which the apples cannot readily be seen or inspected.

"That the standard closed packages for apples which shall be shipped or delivered for shipment in interstate or foreign commerce or sold or offered for sale within the District of Columbia or the territories of the United States are as follows:

"The standard box package for apples is a box having a capacity of not less than two thousand three hundred and forty-two cubic inches, when measured level full without distenwion of its parts.
