CHARLEY THORPE IS WEDDED IN EAST

Sportsman and Ex-Jockey, Who Recently Purchased Ranch Near This City Weds Miss Lindell.

OMAHA, Neb., Feb. 2.—Every old-time horseman and every shotgun man of recent date remembers Charley Thorpe. He has just been married to Miss Ida Lindell, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Lindell of Essex, Ia. They will make their home at Geneva, Neb.

Fifteen years ago Charley Thorpe was one of the famous jockeys of the world, riding winning horses in all of the big races in the United States. He followed this profession until he became too heavy, but in the meantime he had made a fortune, which he invested in a horse and cattle ranch out near Geneva, Neb., and a fruit ranch at Medford, Or.

After Charley Thorpe became too portly and weighty to win horse races he went in for trap shooting and was an excellent marksman. Now, however, he is married and is going to settle down, join the meat trust and raise cows and steers.

Charley Thorpe is well known in Medford, having attended the big show here of the Pacific Indians and recently purchasing a ranch south of this city. He has a huge host of friends here who are today wiring their congratulations.

Fair to Cost \$50,000,000.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Feb. 2.—It was announced by the Panama Pacific exposition commission that a chairman of the finance division, upon whose shoulders will fall the duty of superintending the raising of all the funds for the big fair projected to celebrate the completion of the Panama canal in 1915, probably will be named this evening. When this official is chosen the actual work of collecting funds will begin.

The committee has estimated that the fair will cost at least \$50,000,000. This amount its members say is a minimum. One-tenth of this is immediately to secure state or national help.

Beginning today the various and finance committees will hold daily meetings until the preliminary steps necessary to planning until the campaigns are completed.

NINE VICTIMS OF WRECK RECOVERED

Yesterday Three Bodies Washed Ashore—One of Them Is Believed to Be Capt. Duggan.

MARSHFIELD, Or., Feb. 2.—The bodies of nine victims of the Czarina wreck, which resulted in the loss of 24 lives, have been recovered up to date.

Yesterday three bodies were washed ashore. The first was found near the mouth of the Umpqua river, another at Ten Mile creek and the third opposite the wreck. The bodies have not been identified.

One of the recent bodies found is believed to be Captain Duggan; another is thought to be Mat Nicholas.

Taft's Brother Ill.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Feb. 2.—Although suffering pain from an attack of erysipelas, Henry W. Taft of New York, a brother of President Taft, is reported to be considerably improved today by the authorities at the Good Samaritan hospital.
Dr. Edwards, his brother-in-law, who is attending him, would not state when Taft would be able to leave his bed to travel. Three trained nurses are in constant attendance at the bedside.
