On January 21, 1909, we made returns to T. J. Black, Wenatchee, Wash., for \$67.80, covering a box containing 112 Winesops, which figured 60 cents apiece. On the same day we made another return to C. L. Green of Wenatchee for a box of the same fruit for which we received \$14.80.
