It has not been attempted to present anything but the substance of the statutes, for the reason that a digest dealing with their application or interpretation would involve great labor and fill an amount of space greater than the commission thought proper to give to the subject. The igest deals with the general corpoation laws of the states (as distinsuished fro mthe banking laws) only here they were peculiarly accessible or the bank statutes left blank which needed to be supplied. Provisions of the state laws dealing with circulation are omitted as being of no practical value, in view of the present control of circulation by the national banks.

The statutes are systematized as far as possible under the head of each state by division into three general captions-banks, savings banks and trust companies—but in some cases material which applies to one or more classes is presented under one head. Under each of the three captions the following 12 subheads appear:

1. Terms of incorporation, including capital, dividends, surplus, etc. Lasbilities and duties of stock holders and directors.

Supervision, including reports and examinations.

Reserve requirements.

Discount, loan and sometimes
