

CENTRAL POINT IS TO HAVE A TAGDAY

Ladies' Improvement Club of That City Plan to Beautify City—Big Time Promised.

CENTRAL POINT, Or., Feb. 18.—Tuesday, February 22, will be a day of more general interest in Central Point than heretofore, as that, aside from being Washington's birthday, is the day selected by the Ladies' Improvement club as their "tag day," and on that day will be started an aggressive campaign for civic improvement that will ultimately earn for Central Point the title "The City Beautiful."

The ladies are now busily engaged in perfecting their plans, which will, when completed, be the means of securing the funds for the planting of trees and for improving the ground that has been allotted for the city park. Wherefore, your petitioner prays for an order of your honorable body vacating the portions of said subdivision above described.
