as follows: Section 1. It shall be unlawful within the city of Medford, Oregon, after the 18th day of February, 1910, for any person, firm or corporation, to do, perform, conduct or carry on any of the trades, businesses, occupations or professions or vocations hereinafter mentioned without having first paid to the city recorder of said city for license so to do, the amount of license set opposite the respective name and description of such trade, business, occupation, profession or vocation in the schedule following, to-wit:
