

Crater of An Extinct and Isolated Crater South of Boise.

BOISE, Idaho, Feb. 28 .- A confirmation of the report of the terrible death of C. E. Bell, an Idaho miner. who fell 500 feet into the crater of an extinct and isolated volcano near the headwaters of the Bruneau reserve, 100 miles south of Boise, reached here today.

The accident occurred last Monday. Bell and two companions were walking at the time. The former crater. Before his friends could while here.
