| Bodies Are All Recovered, But There are 12 or 15 Miners Still En-tombed-Giross Carelessness is Charged. <br> JUNEAU, Alaska, March 4.-The bodies of 30 miners killed in yesterday's exploaion in the Treadwell mine are in a temporary morgue on Douglas isfand today, six injured are in the hospltal and between 12 and 15 are still in the mine, with no hope for rescue. <br> Twenty-seven men were kllled instantly. The other three have died since in the hospital. <br> Little attempt at rescue work is belng made today because of the absolute imposgibility of it. Forty boxes of glant powder exploded with terrifie force and so completely wrecked the station where the men were working that it will take days to clear away the debris. The men rescued and all the bodies recovered were farther back in the level and were taken through a tunnel fato anothier shaft and thence to the surface. <br> All of the men are forelgners, a motioy crew of Austrians, Servians, Itallans, asd a sprinkling of Scandinavians. The body of Nela Rustgard, the slope boss, is the only one identified. He leaves a widow and tamily.
