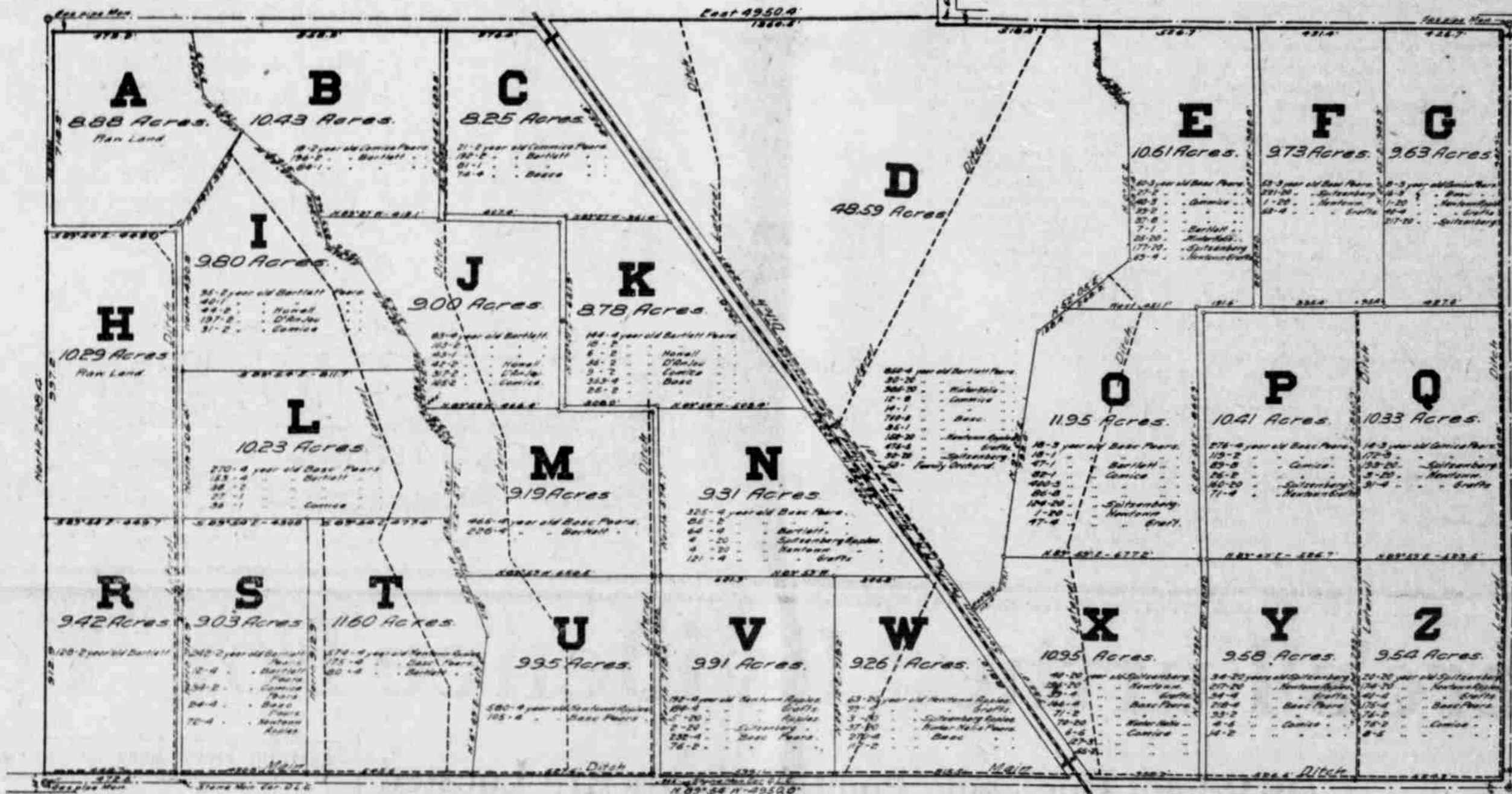

Politicians Opposed by American Federation Plan to Form New Alliance to Drive Labor Leaders From Politics.

C., March 5.—Several New York capitalists and congressmen who have been opposed in their districts for re-election by the American Federation of Labor, are reported today to be behind a new organization formed for the purpose of driving the labor faction from politics. The new organization will be called the National Labor Alliance.

CZARINA SAID TO BE IN FRANCE

Imperial Yacht Is Closely Guarded and These Precautions Give Rise to Report Empress Is Traveling in the South.

PARIS, March 5.—The Russian empress is reported today to be aboard the imperial yacht Standart, which is at Ville, France. The Standart is closely guarded and these precautions have given rise to the belief that the empress left Russia for a cruise in the Mediterranean to regain her health. For more than a year the czarina and czarovitch have endeavored to persuade the czarina to take a sea voyage. Her health became undermined through constant fear of at-

tacks by nihilists upon members of the royal family. The empress hitherto has refused to leave Russia unless accompanied by her husband and children. That she may have consented to leave indicates that the empress was in so serious a condition that physicians compelled her to make the voyage in search of health.

STILL DIVERTING ALL TRAINS NORTH

West and East-Bound Trains From Ogden to San Francisco Are Running by Way of Medford—Strange Trains Call In.

OGDEN, Utah, March 5.—Traffic today over the main line of the Southern Pacific continues to be completely tied up on account of washouts in Nevada. Indications are that the line will not be cleared for ten more days at least, according to railroad officials here. The westbound overland limited, which left Ogden Monday afternoon, returned here today and was immediately started for San Francisco by way of Portland. All through trains to San Fran-

cisco are now being detoured over the Oregon Short Line tracks. This arrangement will continue until the bridges and tracks washed out by the floods in Nevada are repaired. Local traffic between Ogden and Carlin, Nev., and San Francisco and Battle Mountain, Nev., will be handled by local trains.

Each day now sees some five or six passenger trains passing through Medford to the north on their way east. As a consequence, the regular trains are running late.

PRIMARY LAW NEVADA VALID

District Court Judge Upholds Direct Primary Law in Nevada—Case Will Now Go to the Supreme Court.

CARSON, Nev., March 5.—The direct primary law of the state of Nevada is valid, according to Judge Langan of the district court, today. The law was declared constitutional by the court in sustaining the attorney-general's demurrer to a petition to declare the act not constitutional. In handing down his decision, Judge Langan said: "All acts of the legislature are the supreme will of the people and are valid and constitutional unless declared invalid and unconstitutional by the court."
