RESOLUTION.

Be it resolved, by the city council of the city of Medford: That there be and is hereby ordered a special election in said city, to be held on the 21st day of March, 1910, between the hours of 9 o'clock a. m. and 5 o'clock p. m., for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said city at said election for their approval or rejection, a proposed charter amendment to the charter of said city, entitled as follows:

A charter amendment to the charter of the city of Medford, Oregon, amending sub-section 42 of section 25 and section 100 of said charter, fixing the time for which contracts may be entered into and franchises granted by said city, which charter amendment has heretofore been proposed by and ordered submitted to the legal voters of said city, by the city council of said city.

Section 2. The following places are hereby designated as the places in the several wards at which said election will be held: First ward—Commercial club rooms. Second ward—Hotel Nash sample rooms. Third ward—City hall.

Section 3. The following are hereby designated and appointed as judges of said election: For the First ward—L. L. Damon, judge. Geo. P. Lindley, who shall also act as clerk. Chas. W. Davis, who shall also act as clerk.

For the Second ward—L. B. Warner, judge. Wm. Ulrich, who shall also act as clerk. John Bellinger, who shall also act as clerk. For the Third ward—M. F. McCows, judge. H. B. Cady, who shall also act as clerk.

Section 3. The recorder is hereby directed to give notice of said election in the same manner as is provided by the charter in the case of annual elections in said city.
