

# SPokane FIGHTS LA FEAN BILL

### Chamber of Commerce Adopts Resolutions Deploring Change Proposed in the Size of the Apple Box in Northwest.

The Spokane chamber of commerce at a recent meeting came to the aid of the northwest fruitmen with the following resolution:

"Whereas, the apple growers of the northwest in 1906 adopted an apple box of the following dimensions: 10 1/2 x 11 1/2 x 18 inches—that is, 10 1/2 inches deep, 11 1/2 inches wide and 18 inches long, inside measurement—whose cubical contents are 2173.5 cubic inches, or 23 cubic inches more than the standard Winchester bushel; and

"Whereas, said apple box has been used continuously as the standard package in the sale of apples ever since its adoption by the Northwest Fruitgrowers' association, and has met with universal favor among the growers, because practical experience in the packing house had demonstrated that no larger-sized box would pack so expeditiously, ease of handling considered—a very important feature—and,

"Whereas, the Pacific coast states, Idaho and Montana, comprise the only section of the United States in which the apple growers use a box of any description to pack apples in tiers; that Colorado and Utah growers use a larger apple box than the northwest standard, but do not pack their apples in tiers, but use what is known as a 'jumble pack'; and

"Whereas, it is demonstrated that apples properly graded and packed in the northwest standard box in tiers have commanded a better price in the markets of the world, and will, therefore, do more to foster and encourage the apple industry throughout the United States than any other method of packing; and

"Whereas, any change in the size of the apple box would create confusion, increase the cost of production at a time of already too high cost of living and utterly demoralize the apple-packing business; and

"Whereas, there is an attempt being made by the International Apple-Shippers' association to have congress force upon the apple growers of the country a box having a capacity of not less than 2342 cubic inches (a monstrosity, in that no dimensions giving this total capacity are of practical use in a tier pack, the nearest dimensions being 11x12x18, and giving a total capacity of 2376 cubic inches, are absolutely a misfit for a tier pack); and

"Whereas, there is no call for such legislation and no attempt has ever been made to regulate the size of the orange and lemon box, the pear box, the cherry and peach box, or any other box whatsoever used in the handling and sale of fruits of any description; therefore be it

"Resolved, By the Spokane chamber of commerce, which represents the commercial interests of the great apple-growing region, comprising the interior Columbia river basin, and is therefore vitally interested in the continuance of the prosperity of the apple-growing industry, that we earnestly protest against the passage of house bills 2262 and 16919, introduced in congress by Mr. Lafean and referred to the committee on agriculture, or the passage of any other bill or compromise measure fixing a standard of capacity for the apple box other than what is now in use and recognized the world over where apples are tier packed, viz.: 10 1/2 x 11 1/2 x 18 inches, or a total of 2173.5 cubic inches.

"Resolved, That these resolutions be printed and copies presented to the members of the committee on agriculture, to our congressmen and senators and others interested.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 305.

An ordinance assessing the property adjacent to and benefited by the six and eight-inch lateral sewer constructed along South Ivy street for the cost of constructing the same and providing the manner of carrying said assessments into full effect.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. Whereas, the council did heretofore provide by ordinance for the serving of the owners of property adjacent to and benefited by the construction of the lateral sewer hereinafter described to appear before said council and show cause, if any, why property should not be assessed for the construction of said sewer, and did fix a time for hearing any such protest, which notice was given in accordance with said ordinance more than ten days before the beginning of the construction of said sewer, but no protests against said construction or assessment of the cost thereof was made by anyone and said sewer was by said council ordered constructed.

And whereas, the cost of the construction of said sewer has been and hereby is determined to be the sum of \$1452.15.

Section 1. That there is hereby proposed to and submitted to the legal voters of the city of Medford, for approval or rejection, the following proposed amendment to the charter of said city, to-wit:

A charter amendment to the charter of the city of Medford, Oregon, amending sub-section 42 of section 25 and section 100 of said charter, giving the time for which contracts may

#### be entered into and franchises be granted by said city.

The people of the city of Medford do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That sub-section 42 of section 25 of the charter of the city of Medford be amended so as to read as follows:

42. No franchise or contract shall be granted for a longer period than ten years, except street railway franchises, and franchises for the purpose of supplying gas to the city and its inhabitants, which may be granted for such period as the council or legal voters of said city may see fit.

Section 2. That section 100 of the charter of the city of Medford be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 100. No contract shall be entered into by the city or any franchisee granted by it for a longer period than ten years, except franchises for street railways, and for the purpose of supplying gas to the city and its inhabitants, which may be granted for such periods as the council or legal voters of said city may see fit. No franchise shall grant any exclusive right or rights.

Section 3. Be it further resolved, that said charter amendment be so proposed and submitted to the voters of said city as aforesaid, at a special election called and to be held in said city on the 21st day of March, 1910, and that the recorder of said city cause said proposed charter amendment to be printed, published and posted for such of said city as may see fit.

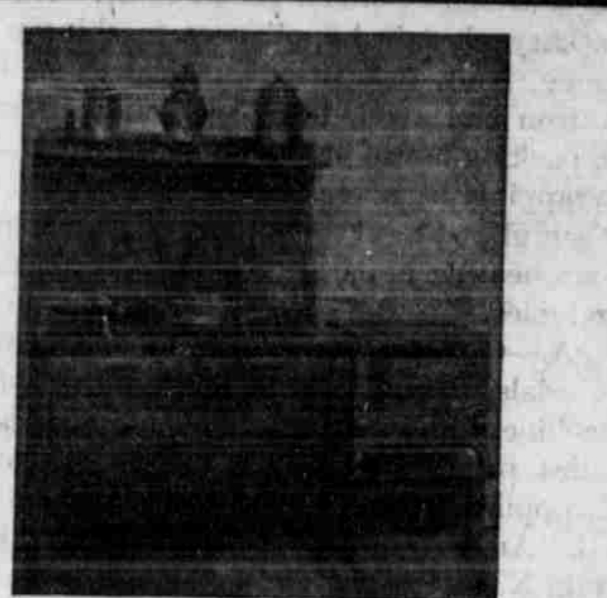
