"My husband," she said today at her home in this city, "is away on a lecture tour. Since they returned from the pole Peary has dropped Matt entirely, and bas held no communication with him nor done a single thing in recognition of his 20 years' service, to say nothing of Matt's having saved Peary's life on more than one occasion. It seems to me such treatment is not fair.

"So far as Peary knows, or cares, for all the interest he has shown, Matt might be starving to death, Such ingratitude is pretty hard. Probably Peary, who is getting all the money, has no time to think of Matt, to whom much of the success of the expedition was due. Matt has never mentioned the matter to Peary, but it does seem as if his hard work of over 20 years might be more fittingly rewarded than by silence and forgetfulness."
