## CHAMBERLAIN IS SPONSOR FOR BILL

### Introduces Measure in Senate to Prevent Discrimination Against Men Wearing Uncle Sam's Uniforms—Result of Theater Managers Action.

WASHINGTON, March 15.—Senator Chamberlain of Oregon Monday introduced a bill in the senate to prevent discrimination against men wearing army, navy or marine uniforms on the part of managers of theaters or other places of public entertainment.

The bill is the result of the action of a local theater manager who refused to allow marines to enter the playhouse because they wore their uniforms.

The men objected and made an issue of the case, forcing the management to practically expel them.

When the matter was called to the attention of the manager of the theater he said that he took the action in accordance with his rules to allow none to enter his theater wearing any unusual costume.

He said that if President Taft dressed in a sweater and golf trousers, applied for a ticket that he would be denied admittance exactly as were the marines.

The matter has attracted considerable attention and has been the subject of much comment in official circles. Navy men consider the action of the manager an affront to the uniform.

## INDIANAPOLIS, TOO, RISES AGAINST THE LONG HATPIN

INDIANAPOLIS, March 15.—Doom for the long hatpin in Indianapolis is spelled in an ordinance in preparation by Councilman George B. Rubens. The majority of the councilmen favor the anti-hatpin measure and will vote for its passage.

"No, this is not the idea of a bachelor," said Rubens, "even though I am one. I believe that every married man will fall in line and support the ordinance. There is nothing to be gained by wearing long hatpins. My measure will require the short hatpins, allowing half an inch projection, or, if a woman chooses to wear a long one, she must have the point covered with a sheath."

"If they're going to wear them so long they ought to be made to wear corks or boxing gloves at the sharp end," said Councilman Fred C. Owens.
