

NO GAYNOR BOOM IN "SHOW ME" STATE

Missouri Democrats Peeved at Interviews Sent Out That Banquet Was for Purpose of Presidential Boom.

ST. LOUIS, Mo., March 16.—Missouri Democrats are somewhat peeved at the interviews sent out from New York that the banquet at Springfield, Mo., scheduled for April 13 and to which an invitation has been extended to Mayor Gaynor of New York City to attend as the guest of honor, is to start a presidential boom for Gaynor. Local Democrats saying nothing like that was intended and say that there will be no banquet at all if the term as the "campaign of misrepresentation is kept up."

Considering that former Governor Folk and other native sons are to attend the banquet the Gaynor boom is not received enthusiastically.

FLOODS SWEEP OVER NORTH DAKOTA LANDS

Missouri Leaves Its Channel and Inundates Lowlands—Steamer "Expansion" Wrecked by the Waters.

BISMARCK, North Dakota, March 16.—Floods are sweeping the lowlands along the Missouri river in this section of the country today.

The river steamer "Expansion" was wrecked by the surging waters. Reports from Mandan indicate that the streets of the town are under water.

Wire communication has been interrupted but no loss of life was reported.
