SYNDICATE BUYS CARR PROPERTY

Will Subdivide Into Town Lots and Place Upon the Market—Thirty-Eight Acres Are Purchased at \$750 an Acre for the Tract.

A syndicate composed of Messrs. Fiero, Wilmeroth, Williams and Abrams have purchased from the Carr heirs and R. P. Little the Carr tract, lying east of Queen Anne addition and north of the Jeff Heard property. The price paid was \$750 an acre for the 38 acres purchased.

The land will be subdivided in city lots and made an addition to Medford. It will be one of the choicest residence sections, commanding a beautiful view of the valley. Jackson street will be cut through to the top of the hill, making it the longest street in the city. Lots and blocks will be laid out similar to those in Queen Anne, of which addition it will be virtually an extension.

Mr. Fiero is the owner of the old Myers' Central Point orchard and heavily interested in city and suburban as well as orchard property. Mr. Wilmeroth is associated with Mr. Speck in the Burrell orchards. Mr. Williams is a recent arrival from Minnesota and Mr. Abrams the purchaser of the Rosenbaum orchard tract.

SALOONS SLAPPED BY GRAND JURY

Find That Large Per Cent of Complaints Come From Saloons of the County—Extend Support as Grand Jury to Support of Officers.

The grand jury completed its labors Wednesday evening and tendered the following report:

"To Hon F. M. Calkins, circuit judge: We, your grand jury, duly empanelled and sworn at the December term of this court and reconvened for special session, March 21, thereafter, beg leave to submit the following final report: "We have found one true bill among the several cases awaiting the action of the grand jury wherein parties had been held by order of magistrates, and two not true bills.

"We find that a large per cent of complaints of violations of the law coming before the grand jury for investigation arise from the saloons of our cities and the environments of the saloons. We wish, as a grand jury, to extend our moral support to the officers of our cities who are trying to enforce the laws and ordinances in their jurisdictions, for it seems deplorable that such large expense of law enforcement should become a county burden when the violations arise under the enjoyment by the cities of special privileges.

"Having completed our labors, we respectfully ask to be relieved from further duty.
