POLICE THINK THEY HAVE NOTED BANDIT

San Jose Authorities Think Their Bandit Is Man Who Terrorized San Francisco During Winter.

SAN JOSE, Cal., April 4.—Charles Chiffen, an Oklahoma cowboy, who confessed that he killed Night Watchman Whyback at Santa Clara March 14, and who confessed to having committed a number of robberies in the vicinity of Santa Clara and San Jose, is accused today of being the notorious "drug store bandit" who terrorized San Francisco this last winter.

Dr. E. H. Gleason of San Francisco, whose drug store was robbed twice by the bandit, arrived here last night, and after seeing Chiffen stated that he was positive that Chiffen was the man sought for man.

Chiffen denied that he had anything to do with the robbery of Gleason's store and laughed heartily when mention was made of the series of letters which the police received, presumably from the desperado.

NEW TREATMENT FOR CURE OF HYDROPHOBIA

ANN ARBOR, Mich., April 4.—Dr. James Cummings, director of the Pasteur Institute of the University of Michigan, today announced the discovery of a new method for the treatment of hydrophobia. The new treatment, Dr. Cummings said, eliminated many of the dangers attending former methods and shortens the time of treatment one week. Dr. Cummings used a virus prepared from the spinal tissue of a rabid animal. This is injected into the patient. The virus is said to have been used in several cases recently with marked success.

IRISH COPS MAINTAIN OWLD IRELAND'S GLORY

Ten Members of San Francisco Police Force Put to Rout 250 Soldiers and 100 Barbary Denizens.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., April 4.—Many battles in world's history have been won by an "Irish brigade," and it was the combined fighting ability of Bohland, Bigelow, Gallagher, Hagheny, Quinn, Fowle and Brady, regulars of the city police force, supplemented by O'Rourke, Shea and O'Brien, special police, that put to rout 250 soldiers and a detachment of 100 embryo sailors in the Barbary Coast early today.

The soldiers, recently from Texas garrisons and now en route for Manila, aided by apprentices from the training ship Pensacola, attempted to "clean out" a Barbary Coast resort because of alleged ill treatment of some of their number night before last.

The soldiers gathered at the Thalia, where they concertedly ordered drinks and refused to pay for them. The Thalia bouncers were merrily harried and harassed and the soldiers were wrecking the place when Chief Martin's Irish brigade arrived. The soldiers and sailors endeavored to form a flying column, but the ten policemen sailed in with their maces and soon the allies were in flight.

A wagon load of men in blue and khaki uniforms was taken to the city prison; a temporary stop on the way was made at the Harbor hospital for repairs to the prisoners.
