The contractor further agrees that it will proceed with the several streets in the order that they may be designated by the city, the city agreeing to promptly designate the streets to be improved and in the order thereof, so as not to delay the contractor in said work. It is further agreed that at least two-thirds of the total yardage provided for by this contract shall be laid with the five-inch base and one-inch asphaltic binder and a two-inch asphaltic wearing surface, the places where said heavier pavement is to be laid to be designated by the city from time to time at the time that streets are to be designated for paving. It is further understood between the parties that the yardage may be increased or decreased by the city, so long as the proportion between the heavier and lighter pavement herein provided for is maintained. The contractor agrees to conform to this date and prosecute the same with all reasonable diligence and dispatch. In consideration whereof the city agrees to pay the contractor for such work and materials the following prices, to-wit: For excavation, per cubic yd. \$ .55 For curved concrete, armored curb, per lineal foot. . . . . 40 For straight concrete curb, per lineal foot. . . . . 40 For combination concrete curb and gutter, per lineal foot. . . . . 64 For gutter only, against existing concrete curb, per square foot. . . . . 19 5-9 For pavement, consisting of five-inch concrete base and one-inch asphaltic binder and a two-inch asphaltic wearing surface, per square yard. . . . . 1.76 For pavement, consisting of four-inch concrete base and one and one-half inch asphaltic binder and a one and one-half inch asphaltic wearing surface, per square yard. . . . . 1.52 For furnishing and laying six-inch cast iron pipe, per lineal foot. . . . . 1.00 For furnishing and laying six-inch vitrified sewer pipe, per lineal foot. . . . . .50 For furnishing and laying eight-inch cast iron pipe, per lineal foot. . . . . 1.35 For furnishing and laying eight-inch vitrified sewer pipe, per lineal foot. . . . . .65 Catch basins, each. . . . . 21.90 Standard monument cases, each. . . . . 2.00 Standard meter boxes, each. . . . . 3.75 The contractor shall look for payment only to the fund reserved, collected and paid into the city treasury for that purpose, and will not require the city of Medford by any legal process or otherwise to pay the same out of any other fund, except as provided for in the charter, unless said city shall fail or neglect to provide such funds by valid assessments upon property affected. Upon completion of improvement of any one street, avenue or alley according to the contract, the city shall forthwith accept the work done and performed by the contractor and this contract shall, to the extent of the work done and performed, be considered consummated, and the city lien provided for by law upon the property benefited by such improvement, unless such assessment shall have been previously created and levied. The contractor hereby agrees to furnish a bond for the faithful performance of this contract, to be approved by the city council of said city for the sum of one hundred thousand (100,000) dollars, guaranteeing in proper form the faithful performance of this contract and further indemnifying the city of Medford against any claims or liens for labor, work or materials on account of sub-contractors, material men, laborers and mechanics furnishing labor or material on this contract.
