### "KNOW OREGON" BANQUET SOON

Students of Oregon University Plan Unique Banquet at Which Only Oregon Products Are to Be Offered—Will Teach Students Much.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, April 16.—Probably one of the most unique banquets ever held in the state is to be held soon by students of the University of Oregon. It is a "Know Oregon" banquet, at which none but Oregon products will be on the menu. Every commercial organization will be asked to furnish its reasons why its locality is the best in the state, and these reasons will be set forth in characteristic booster speeches by prominent students from the various countries.

Likewise, on the belief that the "proof of the pudding is in the eating," each commercial organization must back its reasons with the goods. Thus Hood River will vie with Medford for apples, Marion county with Lane for cherries, Astoria will show its salmon, Yamhill go against the world for walnuts and potatoes, and so on through the list. It is expected that the banquet will be a time of great merriment and at the same time serve to show the students the great resources of all parts of Oregon.

### ASHLAND WANTS A NEW BRIDGE ON MAIN STREET

ASHLAND, Or., April 16.—The matter of the immediate construction of a new and suitable bridge across Ashland creek in front of the fine new Allen-Cunningham block on Main street will be urged on the city council by the committee on streets, parks and highways of the Commercial club, of which committee C. B. Lamkin is chairman. The subject was one discussed by the board of trustees at a meeting held last evening and considered of prime importance at this time, so the committee mentioned was directed to take it up with the council and urge early action. The improvement was one contemplated in connection with the paving operations last year, but owing to the lateness of the season, got sidetracked. Now it is hoped to get the council interested in carrying it forward.

### WAITE MAKES ANOTHER BUY ANNEXING 53 ACRES

Theodore H. Elliott and Martha E. Elliott have sold their 53 acres on Nevada street in Ashland adjoining Bear creek, and being a portion of the old Bennett Million Donation land claim to F. B. ### PENSIONS PAID \$160,993,000

Interesting Statistics Are Brought Out in Connection With Pensions in the Report of the Secretary of the Interior Recently Filed.

WASHINGTON, April 16.—Last year Uncle Sam gave to the 941,000 surviving veterans and widows of veterans of the American wars \$160,993,000 in war pensions.

Details of a paternalistic government's pension business were recently presented to congress by the secretary of the interior. In the number of pensioners Ohio and Pennsylvania lead, each with 92,000 in round numbers. New York has 83,000, Illinois 68,000 and Indiana 57,000.

More than 5000 pensioners live in foreign lands. Canada leads with 2631, Germany has 580, Ireland 460 and England 371. Remote places on the earth to which pension money is sent include the Seychelles Islands, St. Martin, St. Helena, Azores, Bahamas, Turkey, Greece, Liberia, Honduras, Korea, Hongkong and the Isle of Man. The total sent to 64 foreign countries or dependencies is \$863,607 a year.

Three civil war veterans have reached the patriarchal ages of 103, 107 and 108 years, respectively. The oldest veteran of the Mexican war is a comparative youngster of 94 years.

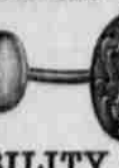
