PRICES FOR GOOD CATTLE ARE STEADY

Hog Market Eases Off Somewhat in Sympathy With Prices Now Being Paid in the East.

PORTLAND, Or., April 18.—Live stock receipts at this market for the week ending today have been 1229 cattle, 19 calves, 2065 hogs and 3285 sheep.

Prices on good cattle have been steady. The hog market has eased off somewhat and sheep have not looked attractive to buyers. The sheep market has been somewhat demoralized and buyers state that the demand for mutton by consumers has not been consistent.

The hog market has eased off in sympathy with much lower prices at eastern centers. However, a high plane of prices obtained with tops at 11.20. There has been a scarcity of good cattle on the market, but with the arrival of a train of Montanas today the receipts show up to the average.

CHINESE OFFICIALS WOULD END TONG WAR

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 18.—Chinese Minister Chang Yin Tang is on his way to San Francisco, where he will meet Prince Chi Tao, expected to arrive there Friday. While he is in the western city he will investigate recent reported outbreaks of the tong wars with the idea in view of planning some way in which the offenders may be punished.

It is reported that some of them may be sent to Chang for punishment.

First Attache Wu Chang has been sent to eastern cities, where tong wars have broken out recently, to make a similar investigation. The matter will be reported to Prince Chi Tao.

It is declared that some of the money collected by the tongs has been sent back to the Chinese officials to stop too rigid inquiry and this matter is also to be investigated.
