

ASSESSOR GRIEVE IS WORKING HARD

Has Placed Mere Deputies in the Field and Expects to Complete Field Work by July 1.

Assessor W. T. Grieve is up to his eyes in work just at present. When the work of assessing commenced Mr. Grieve resolved that, owing to the many objections from Medford over last year's assessment, he would take the work in Medford and Jacksonville precincts personally. He has completed the Jacksonville work and is about ready to start on Medford; in fact, he has done considerable preliminary work here already.

"It is my intention to have, as far as possible, a personal assessment this year," said Mr. Grieve this morning, "that is, I or one of my deputies will secure from the owner personally his assessment. There will be as few as possible of so-called 'office assessments.' In the case of nonresident owners this will be impossible, of course, but we will come as nearly as possible to it. The present ownership maps are a much greater help than one might imagine until he undertook the work. The county never made a better investment than in those maps."

The following deputies are now at work in their respective districts: J. L. Rowe, Sams Valley, Gold Hill, Footh Creek and Roek Point; Sam Sandry, Woodville and Wimer; J. H. Carlton, Eagle Point and Lake Creek; P. M. Janney, Mound and Roxy.

Every son of Sunny Africa who can get away from his Pullman job or doff his walter jacket will be on the platform of the station to give the title holder a sendoff.

A large crowd of negroes will escort Johnson from his home to the train.

Johnson changed his mind about no training until he hits the coast, when he was offered \$3000 by a moving picture company for permitting them to snap him while in action. Jack performed every stunt known to trainers and in a few hours made the greater part of \$3000. The remainder went to his assistants.

Johnson is confident of victory. He declares that he will mix things right from the start and the ring will be the liveliest place in California between bell taps.

LARGEST OIL TANK IN WORLD BURNED TODAY

SAN PABLO, Cal., April 21.—One of the largest oil tanks in the world, with a capacity of 400,000 barrels, is afire here today. The tank was full to the brim with oil and it probably will be several days before the fire can be extinguished.

Standard Oil employes and firemen from adjacent towns are fighting the flames, but are compelled to confine their efforts to saving surrounding property.
