

ROLLING STOCK OF RAILROAD ATTACHED

With Exception of One Locomotive and Mail Car, Oregon & Southwestern Railroad is Tied Up.

COTTAGE GROVE, Or., April 23.—The rolling stock of the Oregon & Southwestern railroad, with the exception of one locomotive and a mail car, was attached here today by Sheriff Brown to satisfy a judgment of the circuit court of Lane county in favor of F. H. Hall and W. B. Foster, for damages aggregating to \$10,000 for injuries sustained by the two men in a wreck on the road about a year ago.

Last week the funds of the company were attached, but only a small amount of money was obtained. The Oregon & Southwestern is 29 miles in length and gives an outlet for the product of nine sawmills along its line. While shipments of lumber from the mills are little hindered, Southern Pacific rolling stock being used for this purpose, the shipment of logs to the sawmills in this city are brought to a standstill and as a result the mills have been forced to suspend operations pending a settlement of the attachment proceedings.

BARNEY OLDFIELD NEARS PORK PRODUCTS IN PORTLAND CHEAPER HIS FORMER RECORD

Lacks Only One Second of Touching World's Record on Circular Track—His Time Was 52 Seconds.

INGLESIDE RACETRACK, Cal., April 23.—Barney Oldfield, in the automobile races this afternoon came within one second of equalling the world's record for one mile on a circular track. Driving his 200-horsepower Benz, he negotiated the distance in 52.

Ben Herscher also failed in his attempt to beat the record. His time in a Darracq was 54.19.

Other results were as follows: Five miles, for class C cars, \$1200 to \$1600—Maxwell, driven by C. O. King; time, 5:34.

Five miles, for cars worth \$1600 to \$2000—Buick, F. Mear; time, 5:33.

Five-mile special for motorcycles—Thor, Charles Balke; time, 4:43.

Hams and Bacon Come Down Cent a Pound—Country Butter Will Also Be Cut 4 Cents a Pound.

PORTLAND, Or., April 23.—Hams, 1 cent a pound lower; bacon, 1 cent a pound under the previous prices here.

These will be the lowered values on pork products that the public will secure Monday morning, for the reduced prices go into effect at that time. No change is announced for lard, but the market is weaker and there is every likelihood for still further reductions.

Reduction in wholesale fresh pork prices will also be shown at the same time, and retail values will show a like effect.

It was decided today to cut the price of country butter to 29 cents a pound, or 4 cents less than the former quotations.
