GREAT GROWTH IN OREGON'S FAMILY

Oregon Journal Collects Figures from Oregon Cities Showing Great Gain Made in Population During Past 10 Years--Total in 1900 Only 300,000.

(Oregon Journal.) Oregon's census count is going to show a ten-year growth that will be equalled by few states. Conservative forecasts on the result of the present count were asked from some of the chief towns about the state this morning. Estimating roughly from these figures, a prediction of 700,000, excluding Portland, seems at this a very fair calculation of the population of Oregon. This morning's report shows that an exceedingly careful count is being made in the towns about the state.

GROWTH IS SHOWN

Here's what happened in Oregon in ten years: The 1900 census gave the state, excluding Portland, 310,369. Get your pencil and figure it out for yourself from the appended:

EUGENE, Ore., April 27--While there are no figures obtainable as to the result of the census being taken in Eugene, it is believed that the census will show up a total population of about 12,000, according to reliable estimates. The population according to the 1900 census was 3236.

MEDFORD, Oregon, April 27--The census of 1900 gave Medford 1791. The city census on January, 1908, gave her 5200. A conservative figure of this census is 9000.

COTTAGE GROVE, Ore., April 27--A conservative estimate of the population of Cottage Grove according to the census count, was 2850. Its population in 1900 was 950.

SALEM, Ore., April 27--Supervisor R. J. Hendricks refuses to make estimate on what the thirteenth census will give Salem, but a conservative estimate places those figures close to 15,000. A very careful count is being made. The federal census of 1900 gave Salem 4258.

ASHLAND, Oregon, April 27--The 1910 census, estimated conservatively on all available reports, will give Ashland a population of about 7900. It will triple the figures of the 1900 census, which gave the city 1600.

ROSEBURG, Ore., April 27--It is thought the census count will show Roseburg has a population of 5000. The 1900 count was 1600.

BAKER CITY, Ore., April 27--According to a forecast based on the enumeration already taken, Baker will have a population exceeding 8500. The 1890 count gave Baker 6663. The Commercial club is working hard to aid in the census men to obtain all the names. Some predict nearly 10,000 people.

LA GRANDE, Ore., April 27--According to a careful estimate, La Grande will show 8000 when the count is completed. Ten years ago the official count was 3000.

SUIT BROUGHT AGAINST COMPANY FOR FRAUD

CHEYENNE, Wyo., April 28.--In a suit filed in the United States circuit court here, conspiracy to defraud, fraudulent stock manipulation and irregular bonding deals are charged against E. W. Cobb, E. A. Norton and F. B. Draper, directors of the Pennsylvania Wyoming Copper company and 14 other corporations.

The complaint alleges that through the acts of the defendants the stockholders were defrauded of from seven to ten millions. The stock of the companies is owned throughout the United States.

David N. Provan brought the suit, representing many other stockholders.
