fight are under arrest.

When McCarthy struck the floor he lay still for a second with his eyes wide open. Then a convulsion seized him, he straightened out and his eyes closed.

**Skull Fractured.**

Doctors jumped into the ring, preceded by the boy's father. For half an hour they attempted to restore consciousness. Failing, an ambulance was called and the young man was taken to the hospital, where it was ascertained that he had sustained a basal fracture of the skull.

**Moran Arrested.**

Soon after McCarthy was removed to the hospital Owen Moran and his second, Jeff Perry and Jimmie Carroll and McCarthy's second, his brothers, William and Johnny McCarthy, and Bert Trenner, were arrested. They were charged with manslaughter when the police were informed of McCarthy's death.

In jail today Moran expressed the greatest sorrow of the death of his opponent.

"This is awful," he said. "I would not have had it occur for all the money in the world. I had been playing for the punch on the jaw for several rounds, and when the time came I 'out it through.'"

**Opposition to Big Fight.**

Opposition to the Jeffries-Johnson fight to be held at Emeryville July 4 is crystallizing here today, following the death of McCarthy.

Leaders of ministerial bodies of San Francisco today are drafting protesting resolutions with which to "bombard" District Attorney Donohue of Oakland, under whose jurisdiction lies the possibility of preventing the big fight.

**Ask Gillette to Act.**

Telegrams are to be sent to Governor Gillette at Sacramento protesting against the killing of a fighter in the prize ring and calling upon the governor to use his moral suasion on District Attorney Donohue, and if Donohue fails to take action, to use his official power to prevent the July 4 fight.

A proclamation is being prepared by the church federation calling upon the better elements in California to join in driving the fighting game from the state and asking all classes in cities and towns of the state to use moral and political pressure on city, county and state officials to "kill" the fighting game in California forever.

Jim Jeffries' comment on the death of Tommy McCarthy was brief.

"Gee, that's pretty tough on old man McCarthy," he said. "They tell me he idolized the kid, and it will surely break the old fellow all up."

"As to just how little McCarthy met his death, I don't know any of the circumstances just now. I presume it was just one of those unfortunate accidents that could not be avoided. A thing like that is likely to occur in most any line of sport—automobileing, hunting, fishing or even in midday pastimes. Nevertheless, it's mighty tough for a family to lose a lad of McCarthy's age."
