CARLOT MOVEMENT CALIFORNIA BEGINS

First Car of Cherries Leaves for East April 29--Climatic Conditions Have Been Favorable.

The California Fruit Distributors under date of May 2 say: The fruit season of California may now be said to have fairly begun, carlot movement having begun.

Cherries--The first full carload of this fruit left the state April 29, this being nine days earlier than the date of shipment of the first car last year. It is probable that this difference in ripening of fruit will be maintained throughout the season.

Apricots--There is no change in this variety. They are growing nicely and with favorable weather early shipments may be expected to appear in a small way within the next two weeks.

Plums and Prunes continue as previously reported. The crop is very satisfactory in all respects.

Peaches are growing rapidly and thinning is going on in all the principal shipping districts.

Bartlett pears--There is no change to report in this fruit, all conditions being very satisfactory. While the crop will not be a large one, it will prove satisfactory in every respect.

Grapes continue to make a fine showing and there is no sign of mildew or other disease at this time. The crop will undoubtedly prove very satisfactory.

Climatic conditions have been favorable and all that could be desired. It is now so late in the season that no adverse conditions can be anticipated and California can be relied upon to produce a bumper crop of all varieties.
