PROTESTS AGAINST FIGHT PILING UP

Congregational Conference of Southern California Adopt Resolutions Against Fight--Forward Copies to Different Officials.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., May 5.—A strong protest against the proposed Jeffries-Johnson fight at Emeryville on July 4 will be lodged with the state and the Alameda county authorities by the Congregational conference of southern California.

At the close of its annual meeting last evening the conference, after considerable debate, passed the following resolution, the copies of which will be sent to the governor and District Attorney Donahue of Alameda county:

Resolved, that this conference call upon the governor for enforcement of the existing laws with the utmost vigor, and upon the legislature for the enactment of more stringent laws against this evil. Be it further
