### Oliver Strikes Hard at Society Fads and False Religions

About 1500 people found their way to the tabernacle last night to hear Evangelist Oliver preach on the subject, "Job's Wife." The text was Job 2:9, "Then, said his wife unto him: 'Dost thou still retain thine integrity? Curse God and die.'"
