MEMBER OF ILLINOIS LEGISLATURE TO BE INDICTED; BRIBERY

Grand Jury Investigating Bribery Charges Will Return at Least One Indictment.

CHICAGO, May 7.—One indictment will be returned against a democratic member of the Illinois legislature by the grand jury investigating the charges of bribery in connection with the election of William Lorimer to the United States senate, according to District Attorney Wayman.

Other indictments charging conspiracy may be returned later, it is intimated.

The investigation, which was based on the charges alleged to have been made by Charles A. White, a member of the lower house, is still under way. It is declared that Wayman has received information that a member of the legislature has corroborated the statement printed in a paper here and purporting to be a confession by White that he had received \$2000 for his vote for Lorimer.

ORDINANCE NO. 328.

An ordinance assessing the property adjacent to and benefited by the eight-inch lateral sewer constructed along West Eighth street and the cost of constructing the same and providing the manner of carrying said assessments into full effect.

The city of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. Whereas, the council did heretofore provide by ordinance for the serving of the owners of property adjacent to and benefited by the construction of the lateral sewer hereinafter described to appear before said council and show cause, if any, why said property should not be assessed for the construction of said sewer, and did fix a time for hearing any such protests, which notice was given in accordance with said ordinance more than ten days before the beginning of the construction of said sewer, but no protests against said construction or assessment of the cost thereof was made by anyone and said sewer was, by said council ordered constructed.
