Later still, C. L. Cranfill occupied the room and for over 12 years sold goods there.

The store front is unique from the fact that the old-fashioued iron doors, such as were in universal use a quarter century ago, are still in place, but are to be removed. Also the window shades still bear the insignia, "Angle & Plymale, General Merchandise," a decade or more after the firm passed out of existence.
