**NEW DRYDOCK AT MARE ISLAND IS ACCEPTED**

VALLEJO, Cal., May 18.—The new drydock at Mare Island navy-yard is now in active service, having been officially accepted by the government.

The dock is the largest on the Pacific coast and was built at a cost of \$2,500,000. Construction was begun seven years ago.

The first warship to enter the drydock was the armored cruiser California, which steamed in late yesterday to a salute of guns of the several ships here. The officers held a banquet in honor of the occasion.

**KOREANS TREMBLE AT APPROACH OF COMET**

Officials and Populace Alike Are Terror-Stricken at Near Approach of Celestial Hobe.

SEOUL, Korea, May 18.—Korean officials and populace alike are becoming terror-stricken at the near approach of Halley's comet. The appearance of the comet has filled the Koreans with forebodings that the celestial visitor is a warning of the downfall of the ancient Yi dynasty. Former Vice Minister Yi Feng Lai, with his family and attendants, fled to Chen Tao, declaring that he was unwilling to witness the fall of the kingdom and the complete triumph of the Japanese invaders.

Fanatics are calling upon the people to rise in revolt against the Japanese conquerors and drive them out. The comet is regarded by them as a signal to rebel. Japanese garrisons in Korea have been reinforced as a precaution against trouble.
