## CHERRY GROWERS GROWING RICH

More Money Made This Season Than for Many Years Past—Buyers Are Promising Seven Cents at Orchard for Royal Annes.

STOCKTON, Cal., May 24.—Cherry-growers are making more money this season than at any time they have had in the business.

The yield has not been as heavy as heretofore, and agents who have been making an effort to buy the crop have been held back, as many of the orchardists refuse to sell until near the delivery time.

The present crop of Black Tartarians is about marketed and this week Royal Annes will begin to arrive and buyers promise 7 cents for that variety, though they may have to pay higher. Black Tartarian cherries were sold in large quantities the past few days at 6 cents a pound, and at times the price went up to 8 cents, finally reaching the top figure of 9½ cents yesterday.

At the ruling prices the canneries are not buying and growers do not look for a market there. They can sell all the fruit they can bring into town at big prices and are not disposed to make offers to the canneries.

If the Royal Anne prices drop, growers look for the canneries to get into the market, but just now the only buyers are shippers, who are taking all the cherries offered. At these high prices cherries are worth \$6000 a car.

## MAN DISAPPEARS; LEAVES PAY CHECK

Employe of Rogue River Canal Company Was Seen to Leave Town for Camp, But Is Missing.

Thomas Woodhead, a native of Hants, Staffordshire, England, an employe of the Rogue River Canal company, has disappeared, not having been seen since February. There is a pay check for a month's work awaiting him at the offices of the company.

Woodhead had worked for some time for the company, being a member of Joe Swansky's gang. He was steady and reliable. In February he asked a few days off and came to town. He was seen to start back, but since that time there is no trace of him. The company would like to learn any news possible of him.

W. F. Turner, auditor of the Pacific & Eastern, also reports that there are a number of pay checks awaiting laborers on the road who have not shown up. These are mostly foreigners.

## FIVE COURT-MARTIALS IN PROGRESS AT MANILA

MANILA, May 23.—With court-martials in progress or just ended affecting five officers of the Twelfth Infantry, with serious friction existing in the Twenty-first, which involves its commanding officer, Colonel Charles A. Williams, and with rumors of disaffection in every regiment now in service in the Philippines grave criticism of General William A. Duval, the new commanding general of the department, is being heard on every side.

The army force on the islands is in a badly demoralized condition. Officers who have been close friends for years are no longer on speaking terms and the feeling between them is reflected among the privates of their commands.

## SHAM BATTLE PLANNED AT AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE

A sham battle in which the cadet regiment will participate and a fancy drill and dance in which the entire student body will take part is the spectacular feature which has been planned for the quarter century celebration at the Oregon Agricultural college. The battle will take place on the afternoon of Monday, June 13, and the drill and dance will be held on the campus on the evening of the same day. For the evening performance the cadets will wear orange-colored capes and the girls will be dressed in fancy uniforms of various kinds, which will give a very fantastic effect to the scene.

## MANY BERRIES LOWER PRICES

Local Produce Drives Out California Fruit—Superior in Size and Quality—Vegetable Market Is Well Supplied.

The local market is well supplied with strawberries from the valley and the past week has seen a slight drop in the prices. They may now be purchased for \$1.40 a crate.

Eagle Point and Talent have been offering many berries and this has had the effect of driving California fruit practically from the market. The local berries are far superior both in size and quality.

The vegetable market is liberally supplied and a number of reductions are noted.

Butter has taken a slight fall owing to the large amount of feed available. Ranch and creamery are now offered at 30 cents.
