Not Enough Left to Make a Pie, Statets St. Louis Apple Buyer-Late Frost Damage in Colorado.

borne, an apple buyer, has returned from a trip through Calhoun county, Illinois, to ascertain the damage the late freeze did to the apple crop, as Calboun county is considered one of the best apple counties in Illinois,

He says the freeze did not leave enough apples to make an apple pie. It made a clean sweep of apples, cherries, pears, peaches, grapes and

The estimate of the county before the freeze was 150,000 to 175,000 barrels of apples.

On the morning of May 17 there was a frost in Grand Junction district, Colorado. No damage was done to fruit in the Clifton-Palisade district, the temperature not going lower than 29. At points further east in the Grand valley district, including Debeque, Grand valley and Rifle, it is reported the damage was heavy. In Delta county, which includes Delta, Hotchkiss and Paonia, considerable damage is reported to apples and slight damage to peaches. At Montrore there was probably 25 per cent damage to apples. No damage at Canon City is reported.
