CHICAGO, Ill., June 1.-The substitution of rings of magnesium for deep snow. The trip was made from the thread in surgery makes possible Horse Camp in 11 hours. Later in the grafting of severed limbs and the repairing of diseased arteries, according to Dr. Victor D. Lespinasse today. The surgeon announced his discovery to an alumni of physicians of the Northwestern University Medical school

Dr. Lespinasse said that he had experimented for five years with magnesium and obtained a perfect blend, so that the rings dissolve as now a thing of the past. Yesterday the arteries or bones grow together. the Klamath Falls Land & Traction Two rings are placed on the severed ends and these are joined by threat holding the ends together. Dr. Lespinasse said that since he obtained the correct consistency of magnesium no experiment had failed.
