

COMBINE TO FIGHT FIRE

Railroads, Timber Owners, States and Forestry Bureau Unite to Prevent Destruction of Forests by Flames—Government Most Active.

Realizing that with the burning of every thousand feet of Oregon standing timber there is a loss of labor amounting to \$8, that stumpage values decrease \$2, and the railroads see the vanishing of tonnage which cannot be replaced for many years, the necessity of adopting safety measures for the prevention of a repetition of the fires of 1902 has led to the organization of several co-operative associations.

"Oregon is becoming thickly populated, which condition will increase rapidly after this year," state District Forester C. S. Chapman, "and it is possible for a repetition of the fire of Miramichi, Wis., to occur here. "That fire covered an area of 2000 square miles, 1500 lives were lost and property to the value of many millions of dollars was destroyed. The Hinkley fire of 1894 burned that place and six other towns, with a loss of life amounting to 500, and but for the aid of the locomotive engineers and their trainmen it would have been much greater.

"The identity of interests has brought the railroads, the timber owners, the states and many people who are dependent upon the lumber industry for employment into close union. Oregon has a forestry board, but as yet no authority has been conferred upon it to employ patrolmen. The government has built several hundred miles of roads and trails, and is maintaining as large a force of guards as it can afford. The public never hears of the losses which are prevented, just as it seldom hears of the railroad wreck which is averted. Fires retard development for years to come, the community loses the wages which would have been paid out for produce in the region affected, the state loses taxes, and sooner or later the result reaches every citizen."

ORDINANCE NO. 343. An ordinance amending section 3 of ordinance No. 30, approved February 10, 1902, fixing the liquor licenses in Medford, Oregon, at the sum of one thousand (\$1000) dollars per annum.

The city of Medford doth ordain as follows: Section 1. That section 3 of ordinance No. 30: "An ordinance to regulate the licensing and sale of spirituous, vinous and malt liquors in the city of Medford, and the manner of enforcing said regulations and to repeal all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance," approved February 10, 1902, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 3. Before any person shall obtain license to sell spirituous, vinous or malt liquors, he shall pay to the city treasurer and take his receipt therefor as follows:

For a license for one year to sell spirituous, vinous or malt liquors, the sum of one thousand (\$1000) dollars; for a license for six months to sell any such liquors, the sum of five hundred (\$500) dollars. No license shall be granted for a shorter period than six months, and no license shall be transferred to any other person by the person to whom it is issued except by the consent of the city council, and duly entered upon the records of said council; and the council may refuse to consent to any such transfer and may refuse a license whenever in its judgment the applicant is not a proper person to have such license, or the building site in which said applicant proposes to carry on said business is not satisfactory to the council, and for the same reason it may cancel or revoke any license issued upon refunding the proportionate part of the license received therefor.

Section 2. Ordinance No. 177 of said city, and all other ordinances of said city in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after May 17, 1910, and all persons conducting the business aforesaid under license from the city bearing date on or after said May 17, 1910, shall pay forthwith to the city treasurer a sum equal to the difference between the license paid by such person and the license exacted hereby, and upon a failure of any person so to do within ten days from the passage of this ordinance his license shall be deemed to be revoked and the proportionate amount due of said license shall be returned to every such person and the mayor and recorder of said city are hereby authorized and directed to draw a warrant therefor without further proceeding by the council.

ORDINANCE NO. 344.

An ordinance amending section 1 of ordinance No. 138 of the city of Medford, Oregon.

The city of Medford doth ordain as follows: Section 1. That ordinance No. 138 of said city, entitled "An ordinance regulating the use and sale of water in the city of Medford, and prescribing rates for the use thereof, and repealing all ordinances in conflict herewith," passed and approved December 17, 1908, be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. The following rates are hereby fixed and specified as the minimum monthly rates to be charged to consumers of water in the city of Medford, Oregon, for the use thereof: Public Garages—Including water to wash vehicles.....\$5.00 to \$15.00 Office buildings and blocks—Each room above the ground floor.....\$0.10 Water closet.....1.50 Each additional water closet......50 Urinal......50 Building purposes—For each 1000 brick laid, including water for mortar......15

Urinal......50 All water rentals shall be paid on the 1st days of January, April, July and October of each year, in advance for the period of three months, provided, however, that in case any person begins the use of water on any premises where the same has not previously been used, he shall pay the proportionate amount in advance up to the next quarterly payment period.

Section 2. That section 12 of said ordinance be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows: No water shall be used by any water user for the purpose of irrigating any other or additional land than that for which water is furnished and charged for by said city. No water shall be used for the purpose of irrigation after 12 o'clock midnight to 5 o'clock a. m., and the times during the day in which water may be used for irrigation may be prescribed by the water committee of the council from time to time, and the city for said purposes may be divided into districts and no water shall be used for irrigation at any other time

than that prescribed by such regulation. Section 3. That section 14 of said ordinance be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: All water furnished on any premises in said city shall be taken and held to have been furnished at the request of the owner of said premises, and no water shall be furnished upon any premises against the objection or protest of the owner thereof.

On failure of any consumer to comply with the rules and regulations hereby established as a condition to the use of city water, or to pay the rates hereby established, on or before fifteen days after the same become due, the water supply of such consumer may be shut off by the city until such time as payment is made of the amount due, together with the sum of \$1.00 additional for the expense of turning the water off and on, and the violated rules and regulations have been fully complied with. Whenever the water is shut off in accordance herewith for non-payment of the amount due, the same shall not be again turned on for use on said premises, either by the person who has failed to make such payment or any other person until all amounts due for water supplied on said premises shall have been paid.

Section 4. Any person who shall violate any provisions of said ordinance No. 138, as amended hereby, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not more than \$50.00.

Section 5. That section 18 of said ordinance be and the same is hereby repealed.
