GILLETTE IS STILL URGED TO ACT

California Executive Receives Another Letter Protesting Against Jeffries-Johnson Fight—May Call in Attorney General.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., June 11.—Governor Gillette today is in receipt of a letter from Attorney J. E. White of the Church Federation here, requesting him to refer the question of preventing the Jeffries-Johnson fight to State Attorney General U. S. Webb. The letter also contains a request that the governor notify Attorney General Webb that the district attorney of San Francisco has refused to take action to prevent the fight.

The Letter's Text.

White's letter, dated June 10, was as follows:

"Some time ago I addressed a telegram to you asking that you take the necessary steps to prevent the so-called Johnson-Jeffries fight from taking place in the city and county of San Francisco on the Fourth of July, 1910, and I desire to say with reference to that event that if it is to be carried out as advertised in the newspapers, it will certainly be against the laws of the state of California. I'll do without talking to any that you, as governor of this state, refer the matter to the attorney general, requesting him to take such steps as will be necessary to enforce the law. The district attorney of the city and county of San Francisco has already declared that he will not interfere, and it seems to me fitting that the executive power of the state should be exerted to the end that the laws may be enforced."

The letter is regarded here by lawyers as a cleverly devised opportunity for the governor to avoid responsibility for any criticism or trouble that might precede or follow the fight.

Gillette Won't Talk.

SACRAMENTO, Cal., June 11.—Governor Gillette refused to say exactly what action he will take regarding the letter of Attorney White, representing the Church Federation, who has written suggesting that the Jeffries-Johnson fight matter be

turned over to Attorney General Webb.

"The letter may be on my desk," said Governor Gillette. "I haven't seen it. When I decide what I shall do, I'll do without talking to any newspapers about the matter."

"I'll not talk about prize fights any more. I don't have anything to do with fights, so I am not going to talk about them."

"If I decide to call in Attorney General Webb, he'll know it."
