

JOHNSON LEAVES TONIGHT FOR RENO

Takes Last Hike Over Roads at Ocean Beach—Today Is Moving Day, But Big Black Does Not Lay Off.

SEAL ROCK TRAINING CAMP, SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., June 23.—Up bright and early, Jack Johnson began his last hike today over the Ocean Beach roads from the Seal Rock camp before the battle on Independence Day. It is moving day at the camp but the champion was determined to do a good day's work so that he would lose as little time as possible by reason of the shift to Reno. A hike over the road, as much gymnasium work as can be done before the packers take away all the machinery and some fast sparring in the program Jack mapped for himself today, and he began it early and with considerable vim.

Tonight the Johnson camp will leave for Reno. A special car has been chartered and will be attached to the train leaving Oakland at 9 p. m. Sig Hart, Frank Sutton, Doc Furry, George Cotton, Dave Mills and Al Kaufman will be in the party. The train will arrive in Reno tomorrow morning and Jack will begin road work as soon as he gets to Nevada. Packing at the camp is almost completed and only enough paraphernalia remains unpacked to allow the camp to keep up its routine for the day.

Everybody at the camp were in good humor. Everyone is anxious to get to Reno and get settled at the new quarters there, so that the last few days of hard work can be undertaken.

At the outside there is only one week's work for the champion at Reno, and the trainers want him to get there and be settled in time to get the most good from the training. None of the trainers believe the change make any difference to Johnson. They declare that he is in splendid condition and that a change to Reno and the higher altitude will not affect him in the least.

CITY NOTICES.

ORDINANCE NO. 347.
An ordinance assessing the property adjacent to and benefitted by the eight-inch lateral sewer constructed along East Eighth street, for the cost of constructing the same and providing the manner of carrying said assessment into full effect.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:
Section 1. Whereas, the council did heretofore provide by ordinance for the serving of the owners of property adjacent to and benefitted by the construction of the lateral sewer hereinafter described to appear before said council and show cause, if any, why said property should not be assessed for the construction of the said sewer, and did fix a time for hearing any such protests, which notice was given in accordance with said ordinance more than ten days before the beginning of the construction of said sewer, but no protest against said construction or assessment of the costs thereof was made by anyone and said sewer was, by said council ordered constructed.

And whereas, the cost of the construction of said sewer has been and hereby is determined to be the sum of \$956.25.

Now therefore, said city doth ordain and declare that each parcel of property described below is adjacent to and benefitted by that certain lateral sewer eight inches in size, constructed on East Eighth street from Riverside avenue to De Anio street, and that the proportion of the costs of said sewer, which each of said parcels of land should bear, be assessed by said several tracts of land, in the amount set opposite the description of each such parcel below; that each of said parcels is actually benefitted in the amount set opposite its description below by the construction of said sewer, and that said several amounts represent the proportional benefits of said several parcels from said sewer. And each of said parcels is hereby assessed the amount set opposite its description below, for the construction of said sewer.
