PORTLANDER SLAYS WIFE

Following Quarrel at Home, H. M. Lambert Shoots Spouse Down on Street and Empties Revolver in His Own Breast.

PORTLAND, Or., July 2.—Following a quarrel at their home, H. M. Lambert, 35, a carpenter, this afternoon shot his wife three times in the breast and sent two bullets into his own body. Both were taken to a hospital, where they are reported to be dying. The shooting occurred on Dekum avenue and Sixteenth street, in the presence of scores of people. The couple have two small children. According to witnesses, Lambert met his wife at the intersection of the thoroughfares and shot her down without a word. Neighbors declare that the couple had quarreled almost continuously for several weeks. This forenoon they were particularly bitter toward each other, it is said, and Lambert left the house enraged.

UNDERTAKER WEDS IN FUNERAL TRIPPINGS

SAN BERNARDINO, Cal., July 2.—Although the ceremony that made them man and wife savored more of a funeral than a nuptial service, Charles Duval Conner and his bride, who was Nellie Viola Lewis, joyously began their honeymoon today. Conner is an undertaker. Late yesterday he brought his sweetheart here from Los Angeles and hurried to the undertaking establishment of a friend. Standing amid a sepulchral array of caskets and funeral trappings, they were married. The clergyman who performed the ceremony was an undertaker before he qualified for the cloth.

DENMARK RULED WITH OUT CABINET

COPENHAGEN, July 2.—Denmark is without a cabinet today, following the acceptance by King Frederick of the resignation of his cabinet members. The government's defeat in the recent election, in which its plan to reorganize the national diet was at stake, is given as the cause of the cabinet's action. Premier Zahle and the other ministers sought to resign May 27, but on request of the king they retained their portfolios for the time being.

We will serve Christmas Dinner at "The Hotel Medford," to be constructed at once at the north-west corner of Main and Ivy streets.

\$12,500—Thirty-two acres, two miles from Talent, Anderson creek bottom land; five-room box house, good barn and other outbuildings; there are on this place 12 acres in Newtown and Spitzenberg apples, 6 and 7 years old, which have a fair crop this year; between the apples are peach fillers, which are heavily loaded. In addition there are three acres of pears 2 years old and three acres planted to pears last winter; also four acres of alfalfa and about five acres of fine timber; there are two good wells and a complete pumping plant for irrigation; \$6500 will handle this place and the balance can be paid at the rate of \$1000 a year.

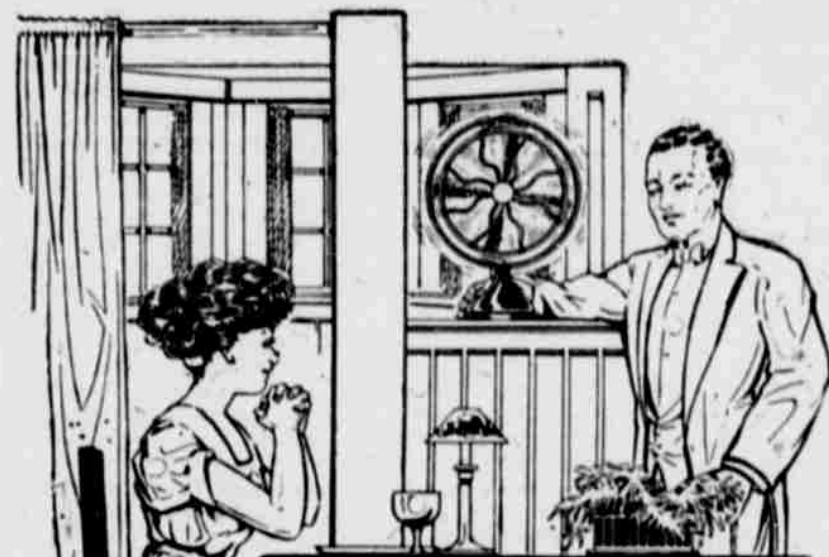
