Things Worth Knowing. New bread may be cut quite evenly Never put salt into soup when cooking until it is skimmed, as sait pre-

vents the seum from rising. When baking cake or bread if the oven gets too hot the temperature may be reduced by placing a pan of cold

water in the oven. In preparing bread for toast and for sandwiches, where the crust is to be removed, try using a pair of sharp scissors to trim the edges. It takes much less time and makes a neater job. Keep a pair of scissors in your


