\$25,000,000 LOSE OUT ON FIGHT PICTURES

BOSTON, Mass., July 13.—Twenty-five million people have already been prevented from seeing the Jeffris-Johnson fight pictures by the crusade against them, according to Secretary William Shaw, of the Christian Endeavor society.

According to Shaw, the opposition to the pictures has made it impossible for the films to be shown to 9,000,000 in Maine, Texas, Georgia, Virginia and the District of Columbia. He estimates 500,000 persons in 40 American cities will not see the pictures.

Millions in countries out of the United States, Shaw says, will also fail to see the pictures because of the opposition. In South Africa, he estimates 6,000,000 will miss the exhibitions and 2,000,000 in Cuba.

CITY NOTICES.

ORDINANCE NO. 353.

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000) Dollars of the General Fund Bonds of the City of Medford, Oregon.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows: Whereas, there were duly issued by the City of Medford on the 4th day of August, 1900, Thirty Thousand (\$30,000) Dollars of the General Fund Bonds of the City of Medford, which Bonds will be due and payable on the 1st day of August, 1910, and which Bonds bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum.

Whereas, it is necessary that said City issue an equal amount of its General Fund Bonds for the purpose of refunding the principal of said Bonds upon their maturing, and

Whereas, the Council deems it for the best interest of said city to refund said outstanding indebtedness at the same rate of interest as the same now bear.

Section 1. Now, Therefore, the City of Medford doth ordain as follows: That there is hereby authorized to be issued by the City of Medford its General Fund Bonds in the amount of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000) Dollars.

Section 2. Said Bonds shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, and shall mature twenty years after their date, and shall be issued in denominations of five hundred (\$500) dollars each. They shall be in the following form:

CITY OF MEDFORD. State of Oregon. KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That the City of Medford, in the County of Jackson and State of Oregon, for value received, hereby agrees and promises to pay the bearer the sum of Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars in Gold Coin of the United States of America, on the presentation and surrender of this obligation on the 1st day of August in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirtieth, without grace, with interest thereon from the date hereof until redeemed at the rate of five per cent, per annum, payable semi-annually, in like coin, on the first day of February and the first day of August in each year on the presentation and surrender of the proper coupons hereto annexed, principal and interest payable at the office of the Treasurer of the City of Medford.

This Bond is one of a series aggregating Thirty Thousand (\$30,000) Dollars, authorized by Section 73 of the Charter of the City of Medford, and is an obligation of the City of Medford aforesaid, and it is further certified that all the requirements of law have been fully complied with by the proper officers in the issuance of this Bond, and that the total amount of this issue does not exceed the limit prescribed by the Charter of said City.

For the fulfillment of the conditions of this obligation the faith and credit of the City of Medford are hereby pledged.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF this Bond has been signed by the Mayor and attested by the Recorder of the City of Medford and the corporate seal of the City of Medford hereto affixed this 1st day of August, 1910.

Attest: Recorder of the City of Medford. Section 3. Each of said Bonds shall have attached thereto forty coupons, each of which shall be in the following form:

CITY OF MEDFORD. State of Oregon. Will pay to the bearer Twelve and 50-100 (\$12.50) Dollars in Gold Coin of the United States of America, at the office of the Treasurer of said City on the 1st day of August, 1910, being six months' interest on General Fund Bond Number of said City, bearing the date of August 1, 1910.

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Recorder of the City of Medford. Said coupons shall be numbered from one to forty respectively.

Section 4. The Mayor and Recorder of said City are hereby authorized to execute said Bonds on behalf of said City and to attach thereto the corporate seal of said city.

Section 5. The recorder is hereby directed to publish notice in the Medford Mail Tribune of the City of Medford in each issue thereof from July 10th to July 20th, inclusive, that the Council will receive sealed proposals for the purchase of said Bonds, at not less than par and accrued interest, at a meeting of the Council to be held on the 29th day of July, 1910, at 7:30 p. m., in the Council Chamber in said city.

Said notice shall require each proposition for the purchase of said Bonds, or any portion thereof, to be accompanied by a certified check of some National Bank or state bank within the State of Oregon, of five per cent of the amount bid for said Bonds, or portion thereof, and shall announce that the Council of said City reserves the right to reject any and all bids and propositions submitted for said Bonds or any portion thereof.

ORDINANCE NO. 356.

AN ORDINANCE declaring the assessment on the property benefited for the cost of laying a six-inch water main on Dakota Avenue and directing the Recorder to enter a statement thereof in the Water Main Lien Docket.

The City of Medford doth ordain as follows:

Section 1. Whereas, the City Council doth heretofore, by resolution declare its intention to lay a six-inch water main on Dakota Avenue and to assess the cost thereof on the property fronting on said portion of said street in proportion to the frontage of said property, and fix a time and place for hearing protests against the laying of said water main on said part of said street and the assessments of the cost thereof as aforesaid.

And Whereas, said resolution was duly published and posted as required by section 116 of the charter of said city:

And Whereas, a meeting of the Council was held at the time and place fixed in the said resolution, for the purpose of considering any such protests but no protests were at said time or at any other time made to or received by the Council to the said laying of said water main or the assessment of the cost as aforesaid, and said Council having considered the matter, and deeming it of material benefit to said city, and that all property to be assessed therefor would be benefited thereby to the extent of the probable amount of the respective assessments to be levied against said property did order said main laid.

And Whereas, the cost of the said water main has been and hereby is determined to be the sum of \$3259.28.

Now, Therefore, it is hereby further determined that the proportionate share of said cost of laying said water main of each parcel of property fronting on said portion of said street is the amount set opposite the description of each parcel of land below, and that each piece or parcel of land benefited by the laying of the said main to the full extent of the amount so set opposite the description of the same, and that the respective amounts represent the proportional benefits of said water main to said respective parcels of land, and also the proportional frontage thereof on said street, and the council does hereby declare each of the parcels of property described below to be assessed and each of the same is hereby assessed to the amount set opposite each description for the cost of laying said water main.
