

# MANY PRIZES TO BE OFFERED AT SPOKANE SHOW

Over \$20,000 in Premiums Will Be Given Apple-Growers of the World Who Enter Exhibits at National Apple Show This Year.

SPOKANE, Wash., July 16.—Cash prizes and premiums of a total value of \$20,000 will be distributed in the various contests, free and open to the world, ranging from the sweepstakes in the carload to a single plate of five apples, at the third National Apple Show in Spokane the week of November 14. Entries in the several classes should be filed with the management not later than November 9, and all exhibits must be delivered in the exhibition buildings before 12 o'clock noon on November 12.
