DEATH BEATEN BY GANS IN RACE TO HIS OLD HOME

Wasted by Consumption and Doomed to Take the Final Count Within Three Days, the "Old Master" Rests at Home of His Mammy.

BALTIMORE, Md., Aug. 6.—Wasted by consumption and doomed, according to his physicians, to bear the final count within three days, Joe Gans is lying at the home of his "mammy," victorious in his race from Arizona against the grim reaper. Around the dying fighter's bedside are his boyhood friends, bowed in grief at the sight of the disease-ravaged form of the once great fighter.

The "old master" is barely conscious, rallying at the half hourly intervals at which his wife tenderly administers the powerful medicines that are prolonging his life. Dr. Jay, the famous specialist, is in constant attendance on Gans. Oxygen is used to keep the former champion alive.

SEATTLE IS A CLOSED TOWN

Restricted District is Nailed Shut by Restraining Order of Judge—Is Sweeping in Effect—Case is to be Tried on Monday.

SEATTLE, Wash., Aug. 6.—Seattle's restricted district is closed tonight. Pending the hearing of an application for a petition for a permanent injunction, Judge Gilliam of the superior court today issued the most sweeping temporary restraining order ever handed down by a court in Seattle.

Deputy sheriffs were busy this afternoon serving the persons concerned, the order restraining the members of the city council, Mayor Gill and Chief Wapenstein from interfering. It restrains the property owners and lessees of property in the tenderloin from permitting their property to be used for disorderly purposes.

It restrains the occupants themselves from continuing their traffic. The order is operative until Monday, when the hearing for a permanent injunction will be held.

The reform forces are backing the fight on the district.

MANY CHINESE AWAIT CHANCE TO SNEAK IN

PORTLAND, Or., Aug. 6.—That 30,000 Chinese are waiting in Canada for an opportunity to enter the United States and that a fleet of 20 gasoline launches is employed regularly along Puget sound in the smuggling of Chinese and opium into the United States is the belief of government officials who have recently made investigations.

Many of the contraband Chinese are landed in Canada as stowaways and later are transferred to the cannery towns along the sound. As opportunity is presented the Chinese are hurried south into Oregon and California.

Through the use of light draft launches, the skippers of the smuggling fleet are said to be immune from the operations of the revenue cutter, which has been detailed to watch them, the government boat drawing 16 feet.

It is believed that many of the Chinese now in Canada have paid the "head tax" demanded by that government and are being schooled for the time when they shall be apprehended in the United States and shall have to furnish an account of their presence before the courts.

MEARS IS OUT FOR LEGISLATURE

Candidacy Announced for Republican Nomination on Anti-Assembly Platform—Believes in Statement One and Direct Legislation.

MEDFORD, Or., Aug. 6.—Medford Mail Tribune, Medford, Oregon—To the Editor: Through the columns of your paper I desire to announce myself as a candidate for representative to the state legislature in the republican primaries. It is right and due the people of Jackson county that they know just where the candidates for a political office stand at the opening of the campaign. The coming election will be a contest as to the right of the people to rule without fear or favor of a few machine politicians working under the cloak of the assembly.

I believe in progressive republicanism, which means justice to every man. I am in favor of the initiative, referendum and recall.

The right of the people to elect their public officials amounts to but little when the right to nominate these officials is taken away. Therefore I favor the direct primaries and am opposed to the assembly, which stands for a government of the few for the privileged classes. I am against all railroad and corporate influence in politics.

I favor Statement No. One for it enables the people of Oregon to choose their United States senators, the legislators who represent the people simply registering the people's choice.

I favor the income tax amendment to the Constitution of the United States. I believe that free text books should be furnished to every child in our public schools.

If nominated and elected, I shall represent all sections of Jackson county fairly and impartially. If the people send me to the legislature, I shall favor the enactment into law of those political and moral principles which will uplift the community, the state and the nation.

The republican party was born as a party of freedom and progress. I believe in the ideals and principles that gave birth to the republican party and therefore am persuaded that I can best serve my party by rightly serving the people.

The issue of this campaign as far as the legislature is concerned is that of the primary vs. the assembly, the right of the people to rule as against the rule of the few working through the assembly. It is a contest to decide whether the plain people, as Lincoln loved to call them, shall rule for the benefit of all, or the few, controlled by selfishness and by privilege, shall make of the party of Lincoln a party of special interests, by special interests, and for special interests. This is not my fight; it is the people's fight. Upon this issue I offer myself as a candidate for the legislature in the republican primaries.

WEALTHY LAWYER IS MURDERED

Man Found Dying Not Far From His Home—Jewelry and Valuables Not Taken—Sensational Developments Expected.

CLEVELAND, O., Aug. 6.—Following the mysterious murder of William L. Rice, a wealthy lawyer, who was shot and killed last night near his Euclid Heights home, the Cleveland Law club today offered a reward of \$5000 for the arrest and conviction of the murderer.

Rice was found dying not far from his house. There were two bullet wounds over the right eye. He was taken to his residence, where he died today.

Rice is not known to have had an enemy and it is believed he was shot by a highwayman, although his money and jewelry were not taken. It is thought the murderer was frightened away before he could rob his victim. Rice was attacked in front of the home of former Governor Myron T. Herrick.

After a "third degree" examination of John Grimes, Rice's chauffeur, the police have abandoned the theory that the wealthy attorney was killed by highwaymen.

Grimes, the police say, named a man whose capture will give rise to sensational developments. Detectives are now seeking this person.

Crippen Bought Drug. LONDON, Aug. 6.—Scotland Yard detectives, working on the Crippen case, learned today that Crippen purchased five grains of yosceline on January 19. This drug was used by him to prepare medicines, according to the police. An analysis of the viscera of the body found in the cellar of Dr. Crippen's house at Islington is being made in the belief that traces of yosceline will be discovered.

SPOKANE, Wash., Aug. 6.—W. H. Kinter, a market gardener at Greenacres in the Spokane valley a few miles east of Spokane is in a peck of trouble over buying a horse that was raised and broken to harness by Wong Yet, a tiller of the soil. He paid \$45 for the animal, which he admits is sound and well trained, but he adds tearfully, he has worn his patience and three whips to a frazzle in attempts to make the 3-year-old colt understand the meaning of "Giddyap" and "Whoa."
