

# 18 INNINGS, NO RUNS AT OAKLAND

OAKLAND, Cal., Aug. 6.—Eighteen no-run innings was the stuff peddled out to the fans at this afternoon's ball game in this city. The game was called in the eighteenth. Here is the way it was done:

First—Portland: Ryan out, Cutshaw to Cameron; Olson out, Wolverton to Cameron; Rapps out, Cutshaw to Cameron. No runs. Oakland: Hogan flied to Olsen; Wares out, Olson to Rapps; Maggart out, Sheehan to Rapps. No runs.

Second—Portland: Fisher singled and was forced at second by Casey's grounder, Cutshaw to Wares; Casey stole second and tried to score on Mitze's wild throw, but was caught at the plate, Hogan to Mitze; Sheehan walked and stole second; Spears grounded out to Cameron. No runs. Oakland: Cameron singled; Wolverton flied to Olson; Cameron caught asleep at first, Boyce to Rapps; Cutshaw singled and stole second; Carroll fanned. No runs.

Third—Portland: Ort out, Wares to Cameron; Boyce out, Wolverton to Cameron; Ryan out, Cameron to Willis. No runs. Oakland: Mitze out, Sheehan to Rapps; Willis out, Casey to Rapps; Hogan flied to Spears. No runs.

Fourth—Portland: Olson flied to Maggart; Rapps out, Wares to Cameron; Fisher flied to Maggart. No runs. Oakland: Wares fanned; Maggart singled, stole second and took third on Boyce's wild throw to second; Cameron flied to Ort and Maggart was caught at the plate on the throw-in, Ort to Fisher. No runs.

Fifth—Portland: Casey out, Wares to Cameron; Sheehan walked; Spears singled; Ort forced Spears at second; Wares to Cutshaw; Sheehan out at plate trying score on passed ball, Mitze to Willis. No runs. Seventh—Portland: Rapps out, Cutshaw to Cameron; Fisher singled and took second on Casey's out, Cutshaw to Cameron; he went to third on a wild pitch by Willis; Sheehan walked and stole second; Spears flied to Wares. No runs. Oakland: Wolverton flied to Spears; Cutshaw out, Casey to Rapps; Carroll flied to Olson. No runs.

Eighth—Portland: Ort flied to Wares; Boyce fanned; Ryan doubled and went to third, when Wolverton dropped Olson's grounder; Olson stole second; Rapps out, Cutshaw to Cameron. No runs. Oakland: Mitze out, Boyce to Rapps; Willis singled; Hogan flied to Spears; Wares forced Willis at second, Rapps to Olson. No runs.

Ninth—Portland: Fisher singled; Casey safe on Willis' error; both runners advanced on Sheehan's sacrifice, Cameron to Cutshaw; Spears walked, filling the bags; Ort grounded to Wolverton, forcing Fisher at the plate, Wolverton to Mitze; McCredie, batting for Boyce, forced Ort at second on a grounder to Wares. No runs. Oakland: Krapp replaced Boyce; Maggart out, Olson to Rapps; Cameron walked; Wolverton forced Cameron at second, Olson to Casey; Cutshaw grounded to Rapps. No runs.

Tenth—Portland: Royan out, Cutshaw to Cameron; Olson flied to Hogan; Rapps out, Wolverton to Cameron. No runs. Oakland: Carroll flied; Mitze hit by pitcher; Willis forced Mitze at second; Olson to Casey; Hogan out, Krapp to Rapps. No runs.

Eleventh—Portland: Fisher flied to Wares; Casey singled; Sheehan hit into a double play, Cutshaw to Wares to Cameron. No runs. Oakland: Wares, after fouling 16 times, was out, Olson to Rapps; Maggart walked; Cameron hit into a double play, Olson to Rapps. No runs.

Twelfth—Portland: Spears hit by pitched ball; Ort hit into double play, Wares to Cutshaw to Cameron; Krapp doubled; Ryan grounded to Cameron. No runs. Oakland: Wolverton safe on Olson's error; Cutshaw sacrificed, Krapp to Casey; Carroll out to Rapps, sent Wolverton to third; Thomas, batting for Mitze, walked; Willis forced Thomas at second, Olson to Casey. No runs.

Thirteenth—Portland: Olson out, Wolverton to Cameron; Rapps flied to Wares; Fisher flied out to Hogan. No runs. Oakland: Hogan and Wares fanned; Maggart flied to Spears. No runs.

Fourteenth—Portland: Casey walked; Sheehan safe on a fielder's choice; Spears hit into a double play, Wolverton to Cutshaw to Cameron; Casey went to third on the play; Ort flied to Hogan. No runs. Oakland:

Cameron out, Sheehan to Rapps; Wolverton singled; Cutshaw forced Wolverton at second, Olson to Casey; Cutshaw stole second; Carroll out, Sheehan to Rapps. No runs.

Fifteenth—Portland: Krapp flied to Carroll; Ryan grounded to Cameron; Olson singled, but was out stealing second, Willis to Cameron to Wares. No runs. Oakland: Thomas flied to Olson; Willis out, Casey to Rapps; Hogan fanned. No runs.

Sixteenth—Portland: Rapps flied out to Maggart; Fisher singled and was out stealing second, Thomas to Wares; Casey singled; Sheehan flied to Wares. No runs. Oakland: Wares fanned; Maggart walked and took third on Cameron's single; Wolverton flied to Ort; Cutshaw fanned. No runs.

Seventeenth—Portland: Spears fanned; Ort flied to Carroll; Krapp flied to Hogan. No runs. Oakland: Carroll fanned; Thomas walked and stole second; Willis fanned; Hogan hit by pitcher; Wares singled and Thomas was caught at the plate, Spears to Fisher. No runs.
