Pioneer Weather Observer Says July This Year Was Hottest in Past Twenty Years During Which He Has Kept Tab on Weather.

"July of this year," said Emil Britt of Jacksonville, who has been the volunteer observer there for 20 years or more, "was the hottest July that I have record of since I commenced taking observations. To ilinstrate how high the temperature was in comparison with other years, let us go back to 1909. In 1909 there were seven days in July when the temperature was 90 degrees or above. In July this year there were 20 days when the temperature was over 90 and at one time it stood 102. That was in Jacksonville, and I suppose there must have been a difference of from two to four degrees between Medford and Jacksonville."
