LITTLE GIANT SCORES TAFT

Let Him Come Out in the Open, Says La Follette—Says President is Trying to Read Men Out of the Party and Then Covering Up.

MADISON, Wis., Aug. 26.—La Follette's Magazine, issued today, publishes an editorial under the caption "Taft in Wisconsin," which says: "A Beverly dispatch says that President Taft is working on a letter that is to be the republican campaign handbook. It is stated that there is no desire on his part or on the part of anyone of his administration to read anyone out of the party. 'Regarding state fights, there is every reason to believe that President Taft will re-state what he has said many times—that he does not intend to leave the province of the executive to interfere in state fights. 'It is scarcely four months since President Taft dispatched Attorney General Wickersham to Chicago to read the progressives out of the party. The speech was submitted to the president in June. 'Sherman, vice-president by the name of Cannon, left his place in the senate as presiding officer and journeyed to Milwaukee to address a tory assembly, convened for the sole purpose of organizing to defeat a progressive Wisconsin senator and progressive representatives. Those attending appointed a committee which is now engaged in placing funds which were abundantly supplied to defeat all the progressives in the state. 'Sherman understood the purpose of the meeting. He stated he was there at President Taft's request. 'Taft's interest was further shown by telegram of congratulation. 'We have not complained of the president and the vice-president participating in a campaign in Wisconsin against the progressives. We do not protest at the hothouse activities of the administration in placating federal patronage since the tariff bill. 'La Follette's does protest, however, against the dishonesty and cowardice back of such dispatches as the one quoted. Let the president stand in the open. 'The administration presumed to read out republicans from their party voting in accordance with their best convictions. 'The president is directly participating in state fights involving the election of republican senators and congressmen. These are the facts."

WOMAN DEFENDANT IN SUIT FOR \$200,000

NEW YORK, Aug. 26.—Miss Inez Millholland, daughter of a multimillionaire and member of the Woman's Trade Union league, is today defendant in several suits for damages aggregating nearly \$200,000. The plaintiffs are New York shirt waist manufacturers, who allege that their business has been ruined and that they have sustained heavy financial losses from the strike of their employees incited, they claim, by the

members of the league. Mrs. O. B. Hunt and several other socially prominent women, are joined with Miss Millholland as defendants. The Woman's Trade Union league has been active in contributing moral and financial support to girl operatives in the shirtwaist shops of New York. It is this support, coupled with other actions, that the manufacturers allege encouraged the operatives to go on strike.
