

fered, the pears were practically up scathed, even where no orchard heaters were used. Young trees of other kinds are winter killed . under the same conditions, while the pears, apparently because of the peculiar quality of tree and soil, can withstand almost any temperature.

The pear orchards have been the most profitable of the fruit ranches in the Grand valley, which is already famous the world over for the fortames orchardists are making from small tracts. The average yearly output of pears for the past three years has run from 250 to 300 cars, and the growers have realized ap-

proximately \$2 per box on their crops. There are more than 40 varicties of pears grown in the Grand valley at present, although the Anjou, special building is to be erected, be-Kieffer, Bartlett and Flemish Beauty are the most generally grown and also considered the most profitable.
