SUPPLEMENTARY ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

Know all men by these presents: That we, John A. Baxter, B. H. Harris, L. W. Smith and John H. Carkin, the undersigned, directors of the Gold Hill Railroad and Lumber Company, a corporation, and all of them, by virtue of the laws of the State of Oregon in such cases made and provided and pursuant to a resolution adopted by the stockholders of said corporation duly and legally passed, have made and subscribed these Supplementary Articles of Incorporation, for and on the part of said Gold Hill Railroad and Lumber Company aforesaid.

Article I. The name of this corporation shall be the GOLD HILL RAILROAD AND LUMBER COMPANY, and its duration shall be perpetual.

Article II. The enterprise, business, pursuit and occupation in which this Corporation proposes to engage is that of Coal, Oil, Lumber, Realty, Water Power, Railroad, Telegraph and Telephone Lines and Mining for Gold and other Minerals, and it shall have powers as follows:

To mine, buy, sell, import, export, and generally deal in anthracite, bituminous and semi-bituminous coal and to this end purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, hold, own, mortgage, sell, operate, and control any properties thought to contain coal.

To prospect, bore, drill for, and produce oil and natural gas; to purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire lands believed to contain oil and gas and to erect and maintain thereon
