## HANDSOME BANNER FOR PRIZE WINNERS

SPOKANE, Wash., Sept. 3.—Gold and silver banners of striking design and elaborate finish, in addition to substantial cash premiums, will be awarded to winners in carload and a number of other competitions at the third National Apple Show in Spokane November 14 to 19, when prizes of a total value of \$20,000 will be distributed.  
The banners are of heavy silk, handsomely mounted, the hand-painted design being a reproduction of Pomona, the goddess of fruit, with



the name of the winner and the exhibit for which the award was made in the panel. The illustration here-with was made from a photograph of the gold medal award for the best car of Rome Beauty apples exhibited at the 1910 show.

The banner accompanying the championship award in the sweep-stake event in the carload class, with a cash prize of \$1000 to first and \$300 to second, is of cream colored silk, while banners for straight and mixed carload winners are of crimson and pale green silk. The cash prizes in these contests are \$250 and gold medal banners to firsts and \$100 and silver medal banners to seconds.

Special banners will also be awarded in the competitions for district displays, in the improved appliance classes and in the two and two or limited display contest. In addition there will be substantial cash premiums and prizes in kind. The first prize for the limited exhibit is \$200 in cash, a gold medal banner and the J. C. Pearson company silver trophy cup, the second prize being \$100 in gold, a silver medal banner and a barrel of spray.

### AVIATORS TO ATTEMPT PASSAGE OF ALPS RANGE

PARIS, Sept. 3.—Nothing interests the Parisians more at present than the prospect of a great struggle among aviators of all nations to win the prize of \$20,000 which has been offered to the daring airman who first crosses the Alps. Nearly all the French aviators of fame have already entered their names, and some are actually training already.

The route for this sensational aerial voyage is from Brieg, 2400 feet above sea level, through the Simplon Pass (6000 feet), Domodossola, over Lake Maggiore, to Milan. It will take place about September 20, during the Milan aviation week. The start will be made from a meadow about Brieg, close to Lausanne. The aeroplanes will follow the Saline valley, rising toward the pass, and probably about that time they will fly above the white solitudes of the snows.

The first part of the voyage will be relatively easy, as the mountain rises with a gentle gradient, and the descent beyond the pass, as far as Iselle, leads to a wide valley. But farther on toward Pontecorella, the route becomes narrow and rocky and assumes the characteristic aspect of an Alpine gorge.
