### SAN DIEGO FIRE IS NOW UNDER CONTROL

SAN DIEGO, Sept. 3.—After fighting all night with shovels and hatchets and back-firing, 40 fire-fighters, under Forest Supervisor Marshall, Domingo Moro, state fire warden, and three officials of the forest rangers, today succeeded in staying the advance of the flames on Palomar mountain. If a strong wind does not rise it is expected the fire will burn itself out on the lower part of the mountain.
