The California Fruit Distributors under date of September 3, say: The following gives number of cars of deciduous fruit shipped from all points in California for the week (7 days) ending Friday morning, September 2, 1910:

Peaches—213 1-2 cars. This last week's shipment has comprised the bulk of the Salway offerings for the present season. There will be a limited number of cars offered next week...

Pears—73 cars. A very considerable falling off is shown in the shipment of this variety of fruit, which will show further curtailment during the next seven days...

Grapes—317 3-4 cars. The Tokay movement is now in full swing and fruit is reported to be in fine condition and of better quality than usual...
