There has been an increase of 268 the total enrollment in the Medford public schools over that of the reginning of last year. The total enrollment is now 1013, while last year it was 845. The high school at present has 151 students in attendance, while its registration included 125 last fall. The Washington school on the second day has 521 students, while last year on the second day of school there were only 450 enrolled. The enrollment of the north school has grown from 275 to 371.

The rapid growth of the city is re sponsible for the overflow.
