TED'S REFUSAL STIRS TROUBLE

Action of Colonel in Refusing to Sit With Senator Lorimer and Withdrawal of Latter's Invitation May Wreck Club.

CHICAGO, Sept. 10.—Colonel Roosevelt's refusal to sit at the table with Senator William Lorimer of Illinois at the Hamilton club's banquet last evening, and the club's subsequent withdrawal of Lorimer's invitation, threaten today to have far-reaching effects. Roosevelt's stand is commended by every morning paper except the Inter-Ocean. The newspapers predict almost unanimously that the incident will result in widening the already wide breach existing in the republican ranks in Illinois. The Hamilton club immediately too sides when President Patten wired Lorimer last evening withdrawing the invitation. Lorimer is a prominent member of the organization and has a large following. His friends are highly indignant. It appears certain that a deluge of resignations will follow.

CIRCULAR ISSUED ON BORDEAUX MIXTURE

The department of agriculture has published a circular deploring the prejudice existing among apple growers against Bordeaux mixture as a fungicide. The mixture, it is said, is undoubtedly the best all-round fungicide known, and it is unfortunate that the apple growers have to consider the possibility of giving it up; but the rusting of the fruit and the burning of the foliage caused by it are so objectionable that it seems highly desirable, if not necessary, to adopt a less injurious fungicide even at the risk of a partial sacrifice of efficiency in the control of diseases.

During the past three years the writer has been working on the problem of securing a satisfactory substitute for Bordeaux mixture and not without some success. The self-boiled lime-sulphur wash which was developed primarily for spraying peach trees, has been found to be an excellent spray for the control of mild cases of apple diseases and to be entirely harmless to fruit and foliage. The concentrated lime-sulphur solutions, both commercial and home prepared, when diluted to contain about four pounds of sulphur to 50 gallons of water, have proved to be about as effective in the control of apple scab and leaf-spot as Bordeaux mixture and to be much less injurious.

Experiments conducted by the bureau of plant industry during 1909 give evidence of the value of the lime-sulphur sprays as fungicides for summer use. These experiments cover a wide range of conditions, having been conducted in Virginia, Michigan and Arkansas. Eleven varieties were treated. Four different brands of the commercial lime-sulphur solution and a similar home-prepared solution were tested at various strengths. The commercial brands registered from 31 to 33 degrees on the hydrometer scale. They were used alone and in combination with arsenical poisons.

The acreage in apple orchards in this country is rapidly increasing, and in the future the production of apples will undoubtedly be much greater than at present. The writer is of the opinion, however, that there will be no serious overproduction, and that there will always be a good demand for good apples, while the poor stuff so common on our markets today will not pay the expenses of handling. It should be the aim of every orchardist to produce and market nothing but first-class fruit, and if he does this he may reasonably expect always to obtain good returns from his investment.

POINDEXTER HAS CLOSED CAMPAIGN

Insurgent Expects Victory on Next Tuesday. When Washington Primaries Will Be Held—6000 Persons Hear His Last Speech.

SEATTLE, Wash., Sept. 10.—Congressman Miles Poindexter, insurgent, who is seeking the primary nomination for United States senator from Washington, closed his Seattle campaign last night at the Dreamland rink, where a rally of Poindexter followers was held. The primaries are to be held next Tuesday. It was estimated that 6000 persons attended the meeting. Previous to the rally a band paraded the downtown streets. When the band reached the hall it was followed by a procession of 2000 persons. Poindexter was greeted enthusiastically by his audience when he stepped upon the speaker's stand. Poindexter said in part:

"The question is not so much whether you shall have a senator from east of the mountains or a senator from the west of the mountains as it is whether you have a senator from Washington or a senator from St. Paul and Rhode Island. Within the next six years the Panama canal will be completed and when it is completed the great vital commercial issue with the state of Washington is going to be whether the charges through that canal are made in your interests and in the interests of the state, or whether they are to be fixed for the benefit of the trans-continental railroads. John L. Wilson has withdrawn from the contest. He was the most formidable opponent. His following was to a large extent political followers. Some of his following are progressives and most of them are good citizens. Many of them may now climb on the band wagon, and most of them, it is known, will not consent to ride on the delivery wagon."

eminent in high class production in 1910. More fruit will be shipped than in any previous year, and the quality this year will be unsurpassed. The pear orchards are laden with fruit of enormous size. Not less than 300 cars of pears will go forward in the next few weeks, and about 400 cars of apples, yellow and red will follow in September and October.
